Since 1956 for men and 1994 for women, Guest House has been providing a unique Catholic faith-filled, community atmosphere for clergy and men and women religious who are suffering from addiction.

Our holistic treatment services are based on individual client assessment

- Intervention assistance program providing support in the first step in the journey toward recovery
- Comprehensive evaluations: spiritual, psychological, physical and psychosocial
- Intensive, interdisciplinary and interpersonal long-term residential treatment with length of stay based on individual client need
- Short-term residential treatment programs with length of stay based on individual client need

- On-site, recovery-oriented, fulltime medical director offering individualized care with access to specialists from both Trinity and St. John Providence Health Systems
- 24-hour, on-site nursing care
- Consultation and education that includes workshops, retreats and training for community leadership, superiors and formation personnel
- Individualized and group therapy with our full-time therapy staff; psychological support services and psychiatric evaluations provided as needed



The men's program at Guest House utilizes our newly renovated men's treatment center on our 105-acre Lake Orion property, complete with ample walking space and retreat-like grounds that are conducive for healing and recovery. The residential facility offers 16 private suites, dining area with dietician-managed meals and snacks, rooms for individualized and group therapy, common relaxation space and chapel – all in a tranquil and spirit-filled setting.

Our licensed residential treatment centers for women and men religious in Lake Orion, Michigan, are fully accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

- Separate chapels in each treatment center with Mass celebrated daily (except Saturday for women) and individual access to our full-time chaplain for spiritual direction and counseling
- Physical therapy assessment upon admission with on-site therapy appointments, personal training and open exercise times to maximize treatment
- Damascus Program for Men a focused program for those who need to specifically address food addiction

- Individualized food plans designed under the supervision of our registered dietician
- Continuing care program and followup services which extend after treatment for an additional three years for men and five years for women
- On-going alumni seminars and reunions



The women's program at Guest House is located in our new women's treatment center which opened in the fall of 2014. The new women's center is adjoined to the men's center via an enclosed walkway, allowing staff to support clients in both centers effectively and efficiently. Similar to the men's center, the women's facility offers ten private suites, dining area with dietician-managed meal plans, rooms for individual and group therapy, common relaxation space and a chapel – all in a tranquil and spirit-filled setting. Each sister is welcomed into the program with an anointing ceremony. At the end of her treatment, she is able to participate in a departure ceremony – giving her closure to her past and hope for her future in recovery.
